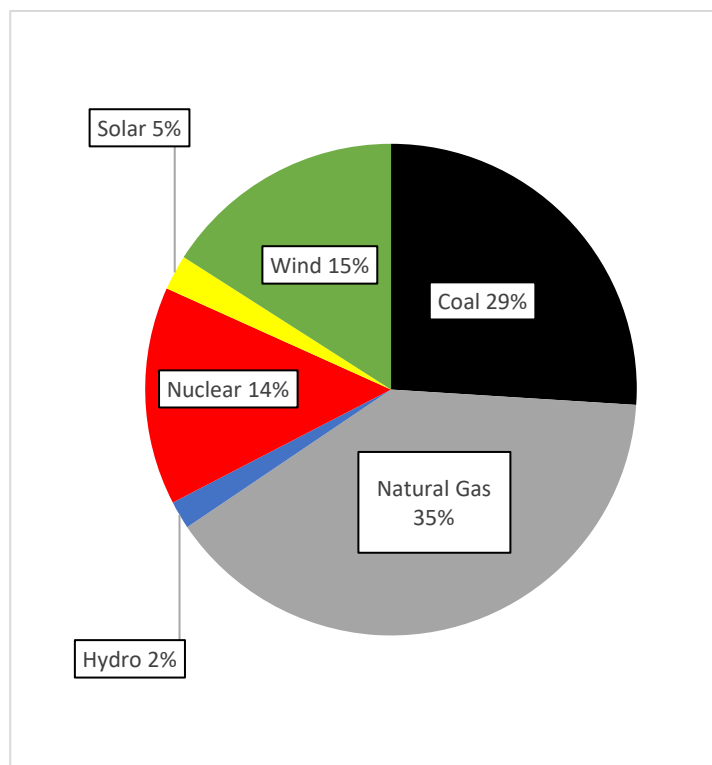

for the 12 months ending 12/31/25**

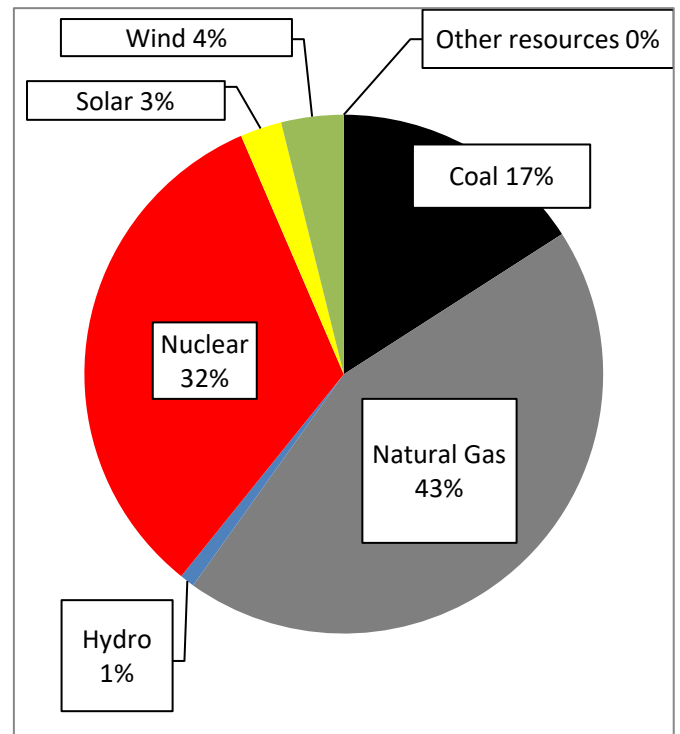
